Applications are invited for seed funding from the Oxford India Centre for Sustainable Development.

3-5 projects are expected to be chosen from an annual budget of £5000.

This money aims to support novel projects in cross disciplinary areas.

Projects should be primary-research based, interdisciplinary, and directly related to sustainable development in India. While it is understood that project results may not generate sufficient data to conclusively answer the research question, project methodology must be sufficiently rigorous so that the data could be used in an expanded project. All data collected from the project should be made available for the OIC website, together with a project report, within 8 months of receiving project funding. The scheme is not designed to supplement ongoing research. Preference will be given to early career researchers (individuals with less than 5 years since completion of their PhD).

The OICSD is concerned for the project's environmental footprints and therefore we require a short report about the project's environmental impact as part of the project description

Deadline for 2015 applications: July 3 2015.
