First and foremost, on behalf of the Somerville Music Society, congratulations on earning your place at Somerville College. Somerville Music Society (SMS) is one of the most active and involved societies in college. We provide each student, regardless of age, course or musical experience, the opportunity to engage in a wide variety of music making around the college. Oxford University has much to offer you musically: from its principal orchestras and ensembles such as the Oxford University Orchestra, to smaller chamber groups as well as well-known a cappella groups, like the Oxford Belles (which consistently boasts strong Somervillian representation). SMS offers a high-quality range of different music and performance opportunities within the College itself. Many of the members of our SMS ensembles and choir frequently perform with university orchestras and ensembles.

### About us

Headed by a small student run committee, SMS consists of several ensembles. Our flagship ensembles are the College Orchestra (non-auditioned) and the professionally-directed College Choir (auditioned). The orchestra is normally student directed, and gives aspiring conductors an invaluable chance to work with a skilled orchestra. Both choir and orchestra give frequent concerts to large audiences in College, most often in our lovely chapel, which houses a new Steinway Grand piano. Last term alone the repertoire on show ranged from Vivaldi to Bernstein, from Bach to Holst. Smaller student-led chamber ensembles are also encouraged to perform. As well as these concerts, SMS also provides open-mic nights in the college bar as well as mid-term Blues nights to provide for all musical tastes. All involvement in the Somerville Music Society is relaxed and enjoyable whether you're organising events with the SMS Committee, playing at our live concerts, or relaxing in the terrace bar at open mic nights.

# Somerville College Choir

Somerville College Choir is one of Oxford's leading mixed-voice choirs, and is directed by Will Dawes (www.willdawes.co.uk). They generally perform on Sunday evenings during term in the 6pm service of Choral Contemplation. Auditions for the choir take place on Thursday and Friday of Fresher's week, with an open rehearsal at 4.45 on Thursday. Choral scholarships are available, and this academic year will see the choir perform in the Sheldonian Theatre, and be the first Oxford College Choir to tour to India (December). ### Instrumental Awards

The instrumental awards, or Margaret Irene Seymour Awards (MIS), are granted annually to two students demonstrating an excellent standard of instrumental playing. Award holders receive a substantial contribution to the cost of their instrumental lessons and are expected to give an annual solo recital at a concert in Hilary term.

It is a good opportunity to introduce yourself to your musical colleagues in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere.
