Onwards and upwards from SCBC: Alumnae in action

It is always a source of pride for SCBC when those who have rowed with us go on to greater heights, especially representing Somerville and Oxford against Cambridge on the Tideway. This year two alumnae were selected to race in dark blue: Amanda Thomas (2016, MPhil General Linguistics and Comparative Philology) for the lightweights and Issy Dodds (2015, Biology) for the openweights. In the latter's case there was a score to settle, having been in the same boat last year when it was beaten by the light blues.

The lightweights raced, on the tideway for the first time ever, on Sunday 15th March. The women's race was thrilling to watch, with Oxford looking promising and pulling out an early lead. Astonishingly, Cambridge managed to defy the textbook and come from behind at Hammersmith Bridge to win. Thomas, who is now studying for a DPhil at Trinity, said of the race,

'I was delighted to be selected for the first Women's Lightweight Boat Race to take place on the Tideway. The race was full of drama and it was a wonderful experience to be part of this historic moment for OUWLRC. Although Cambridge came out on top, I am proud to have raced in such a strong and motivated Oxford crew, especially in a year when very few rowing events are to take place.'

Even as the lightweight crews were putting their boats back on the racks it was looking inevitable that the openweight race would not go ahead due to the pandemic, as was confirmed a few days later. In the mind of this pundit there is no doubt that Dodds and the rest of the crew would have beaten Cambridge hands down.
